From the CEO



The Richmond Hill facility renovation continues to make great progress. The beautiful energy-efficient replacement windows and the repointed exterior bricks has brought out the best in this unique building. The new electrical service and energy-efficient heating system has been completed. The next phase will include

upgrades to the exterior entrances – including a new ramp to the lower level – bathrooms, kitchen and office areas. Bids are being solicited for this work, with a tentative completion date of December 31, 2010.

Our Annual Meeting took place in June, 2010, where we inducted our new Board Chair, Christopher Foxall, as well as new Board members. The Annual ARI Awards were presented to staff, volunteers and Board Members. Our keynote speaker, Ms. Terry Edelman, President/CEO from the Connecticut Community Providers Association, presented an overview of the state of affairs within our state rehabilitation system. She emphasized the importance of working within the political arena to keep legislators apprised of the impact of their decisions upon our most vulnerable citizens.

We planned and hosted the first International Sibling Conference on August, 7-8. We partnered with the Siblings Leadership Network of Chicago, IL, as well as The Kennedy Center Inc., of Trumbull, CT. Over 150 people attended this two-day event at the Greenwich Hyatt Hotel. They chose from dozens of speakers and workshops, all focusing on the challenges of living with a family member with developmental disabilities. Chris Burke, spokesperson of the National Down Syndrome Society, addressed the entire audience during the afternoon. One participant commented, "I just wanted to let you know how helpful the conference was to my sister and me. I not only learned a lot of very useful information, I met so many wonderful people. It was great being surrounded by people who understand me. Thanks again for a life-changing weekend. Can't wait until the next one!"

ARI hosted its 15th annual Lotstein/Martin Golf Tournament on the 19th of August. We had our first afternoon tee-off and raised over \$45,000. This fundraising event continues to have a real impact on our programs and services as we experience shortfalls in revenues from our major funding source, the Department of Developmental Services. The horizon does not look very bright for our state partners, so we must continue to seek alternate means in which to maintain and exceed everyone's expectations.

We thank you for all of your commitment, continued support and advocacy as we strive to fulfill our mission of "always reaching independence" for all of our clients.

The building went through a transformation over 35 years ago to accommodate our clients' needs and this project should carry us through the next few decades. We will be looking to fund the future phases of the project through a capital drive, and so again, I appeal to your kind support to help identify funding sources for this worthy initiative.

As I start my role as Board Chair at ARI, I realize that as much as our community relies on us to provide support when it is needed, we are equally reliant on our community to help us perform our mission. I thank all of you who have contributed your valuable time in the past, and appeal for the same dedication and support over the coming year as we work toward a brighter future.

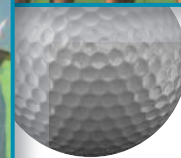
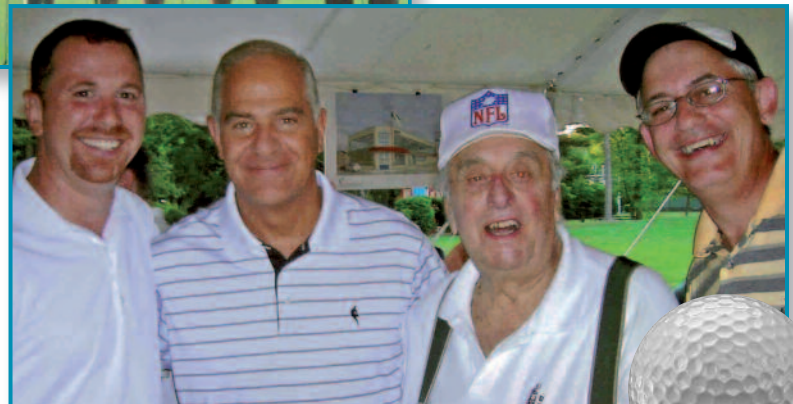
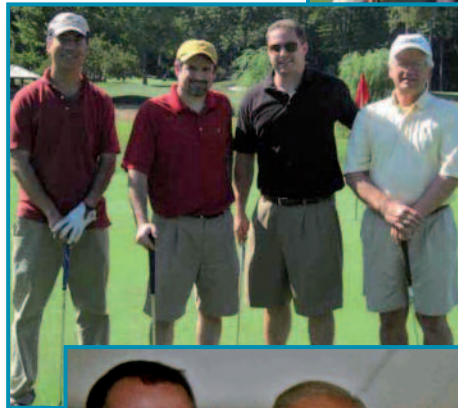
ARI Lotstein/Martin Golf Tournament

First Annual International Sibling Conference

AUGUST 7 – 8, 2010 • HYATT REGENCY HOTEL, GREENWICH, CONNECTICUT

The first International Sibling Conference was held August 6 – 8, at the Hyatt Regency in Old Greenwich, CT. The conference brought together brothers and sisters and other family members of people with various disabilities to discuss their unique needs and concerns. They came from across the US, Canada, Australia, and Japan. Resources were shared to address the challenging positions siblings find themselves in as lifelong advocates and care-givers. Many attendees knew each other, while others met, gratefully, for the first time. The one thing that resonated throughout the weekend was that concerns are the same throughout the world!

The sessions were varied and rich – including discussions about employment, sexuality, family roles, sibling in-laws, Alzheimer's in people with Down Syndrome, and current research about siblings of people with disabilities – all reflecting the complexity of these relationships.

An unspoken but ever-present undercurrent in the discussions was that siblings provide “parenting” throughout their lives. Many of them become guardians for their adult siblings. And, for many of them, childbearing becomes a very complicated, emotional decision.

The event featured dozens of experts in a busy schedule of timely and important issues. The participants are eager for a second conference and have already shared many suggestions for future gatherings, which will be reviewed by the national committee.

“To hear people say that this has been a ‘life-changing experience’ made my dream come true. This is a vision that I’ve had since the ‘70s. Thanks to ARI, the sponsors, and our national and local committee members, this conference was ‘fantastic!’

If you're the sibling of a person with a disability, you would have loved the first International Sibling Conference. Adult siblings from all over the world gathered to talk about our worries, support each other emotionally, and make friends in the sibling community. By the time it ended, we knew that, regardless of our personal struggles, we would always have others to turn to.

ARI Recycling Program

Last fall, High Ridge Park Corporate Center in Stamford, kicked off a new **ARI Recycling Program** in conjunction with our Day Service Options program.

Groups of ARI clients collect and clean cans and bottles from each of the buildings in the center and deposit them for recycling. Darlene Caviness, Manager of Day Service Options, oversees the project. Thus far, they have raised \$800 to purchase curriculum materials, such as DVDs, workbooks, and arts and crafts supplies, for the Day Service Options programs.

The ARI Recycling Program allows clients to learn social and community skills while raising money. The program also teaches clients about helping the environment. For some, the program serves as a "job." For others, the program serves as a stepping stone to competitive employment. Each client benefits from being a part of this team.

The ARI Recycling Program was initiated by Jodi Gutierrez, vice president of property management for George Comfort & Sons and on-site property manager of High Ridge Park Corporate Center, as a way for their tenants to give back to a local non-profit organization. They have also hosted the inaugural (2009) Stamford March for Babies for the March of Dimes, spearheaded the Annual Landlord and Property Manager Blood Drive Challenge for the American Red Cross, and donated \$10,000 to the Stamford Boys & Girls Club for four consecutive years, among many other initiatives.

"Hosting clients from ARI of CT in our offices has been rewarding for us as well," said Jodi Gutierrez. "It's important to us that our office park serves as a greater part of the Stamford community and our tenants really appreciate our collaborative effort in helping both the environment and a local nonprofit."

Fairfield County Community Foundation

ARI of Connecticut, Inc. received a \$10,000 grant from the Fairfield County Community Foundation's (FCCF) Louis and Ruth Sternbach Fund for People with Disabilities. This grant supports respite care programs serving caregivers of adults with disabilities. The grant will support ARI's respite program for up to 15 families in need.

This is ARI of Connecticut, Inc.'s third time joining Men's Wearhouse and approximately 200 other charities to distribute the items collected at Men's Wearhouse locations. Items collected include men's and women's suits, shirts, jackets, ties, belts, and shoes. Residents of Fairfield County may donate their gently used and cleaned items at the Stamford, Trumbull, or Westport locations.

"We are very excited to work with Men's Wearhouse on the National Suit Drive campaign," said Matthew Reyher, President & CEO of ARI. "Proper professional attire really makes a difference in our clients' lives. With these donations, men will have the opportunity to walk into an interview with confidence – an essential first step toward economic stability."

Although the recession has affected a wide spectrum of the American workforce, 82 percent of job losses have befallen men, according to the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics, due to the economy's particularly heavy impact on male-dominated industries like construction and manufacturing. In Stamford, the unemployment rate hit 8.2% in June, proving that many are still struggling to find work.

"With nearly one out of ten working-age men unemployed in this country, the economic downturn has disproportionately hurt the male workforce," said George Zimmer, Men's Wearhouse founder and CEO. "By collecting and donating professional clothing, Men's Wearhouse aims to help men 'suit up' for job interviews and offset the 'mancession.'"

Nationally, Men's Wearhouse hopes to collect more than 100,000 articles of clothing to benefit charities like ARI of Connecticut, Inc. Last year ARI was able to help hundreds of men in Stamford get suited up for their next job interview. For every suit the company collects, it will donate one dress shirt to the cause.
