Molinari Employee Recognition Award, to be given annually to a staff member who exemplifies the mission and values of ARI and who demonstrates extraordinary service to ARI by bridging gaps and making a difference in the lives of a member or members of the Stamford Community.

Seventy years ago a few families came together to fill a significant gap in the Stamford community, where there were no services for children with disabilities. They started a summer camp, and then a preschool. Twenty years after our organization was founded, civil rights were granted and children with disabilities were able to receive a free, appropriate education. The children we were serving went to public school and we became an adult service provider. We opened a vocational training center and our first group home in the 70s.

Since that time, we have honored our founding families, the Dichters, Lotsteins, Martins, and Whites, by remaining focused on their vision to serve the Stamford community by enriching the lives of people with disabilities and their families. While we serve individuals from surrounding towns, we have intentionally remained a local, Stamford based organization.

Along with our founders' vision, YOUR support has guided us over the past 70 years, allowing us to positively impact the lives of those relying on ARI. Today, we provide services to nearly 100 individuals. They live, learn, and work in the most independent setting possible. We encourage and support them to be engaged and integrated in their community.
